

ENDANGERED AUSTRALIAN SPECIES



KOALA

- The threats: Landclearing, disease and climate change are rapidly reducing koala populations.
- What WWF-Australia is doing: Aiming to double koala numbers by 2050 through habitat restoration and stronger environmental laws.
- **How you can help:** Contribute to tree planting initiatives and advocate for habitat protection.



PLATYPUS

- The threats: Habitat destruction, pollution, and bushfires are causing local extinctions.
- What WWF-Australia is doing: Rewilding rivers and restoring habitats to bring platypus back to their former ranges.
- **How you can help:** Support conservation efforts to protect and restore freshwater ecosystems.



BETTONG

- The threats: Predation by introduced species and habitat loss have led to significant declines.
- What WWF-Australia is doing: Collaborating with Traditional Owners to reintroduce bettongs into safe, managed environments.
- How you can help: Donate to rewilding projects and support predator control programs.



NORTHERN HAIRY-NOSED WOMBAT

- The threat: As one of the rarest land mammals in the world, with only 400 individuals remaining in the wild.
 The threats they face are habitat loss and degradation, predation by dingoes and wild dogs, small population size, and competition for resources (livestock).
- What WWF-Australia is doing: Supporting recovery programs to boost population numbers.
- **How you can help:** Donate to support our work to protect and restore the areas they call home.
